PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Earlier this summer our vacation took Karen and me to Wittenberg Germany, home to Martin Luther and a sister city to Springfield. We were there during the wedding anniversary celebration of Luther and Katharina von Bora. It was quite the festival – the largest such event I've ever seen. It took us two full days to see everything.

No trip to Wittenberg would be complete without a visit to the Castle Church where Luther posted his 95 theses. Legend has it that those were posted on the door of the church. It is far more likely a community bulletin board was located next to those doors and the document was posted there instead. Today the original doors have been replaced with doors cast in bronze and emblazoned with the theses.

As is true with all those German cathedrals, the Castle Church, both inside and out, is incredibly ornate and awe-inspiring. I took lots of pictures. Because it is "the most important building in the history of the Reformation" (according to the Wittenberg tourist association), it is a very popular tourist site, one that has been recognized as a UNESCO world heritage site.

That day though I wondered what these tourists, myself included, would have been doing if Luther had opted to remain silent instead of raising his objections to the teachings of the church. Would we even be there? Would anyone care what day he got married?

The truth is we only remember him because he spoke up when he saw the church teaching something contrary to Holy Scripture. As a congregation, we will remember again on the last Sunday of October (October 30). Let's be reminded not only of the truth he proclaimed but our responsibility to be voices of truth in our day as well.

CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Call Committee conducted in person second interviews with several individuals. One candidate visited Grace mid-July for a second interview. He was referred by the call committee to council and returned with his wife in August to visit Grace and tour the surrounding community. After a period of discernment, he withdrew his name from the call process.

We are continuing our efforts in the call process and working with Pastor Shelly Schultz, NALC to that end. Leah Fraker has been working with Matt Cline to produce a video to accompany Grace's Congregational Profile. We also are reaching out to the North American Lutheran Seminary in Ambridge, Pennsylvania to see if there are seminarians who may be available for internship or call.

The Call Committee's work is confidential to protect candidates who may be serving another church. We encourage you to approach any of us with questions regarding the call process. We are blessed with a competent dedicated team – Elaine Bucey, Lori Fain, Leah Fraker, Steve Garrett (Council President and Ex-Officio Member), Mark Grimes, Stacey Laux (Secretary), Eric Leeth (Co-Chair), Su-Ann Newport (Co-Chair), Mike Ray and Matt Rugh – all of whom have been working diligently through the NALC call process. Pastor Tom Brodbeck provides leadership on the call process and is a valuable resource to the committee. Please continue to pray as we work to discern God's will for Grace. Su-Ann Newport

THREE NEW STAFF POSITIONS

Grace is in the process of recruiting three new staff members to join our team.

First, we are searching for a Director of Children and Family Ministry. This full-time position will be the advocate for future generations of the church and will foster an atmosphere that ensures the family of God works together to make disciples of the youngest members of our congregation. The DCFM will work with families of all our youth and children (cradle through high school) and have specific responsibilities for the children's ministry (cradle through 8th grade).

The second position is a Director of Youth Ministry. This position ministers to and serves an advocate for the youth (grades 9-12). This position is charged with creating an atmosphere where these young people mature in their faith and become spiritual leaders in their churches and schools. This will be a part-time position.

The third position is titled Executive Director. This position will only be filled if we are unable to call an Associate Pastor in a relatively short amount of time. We will conduct this search while our Call Committee continues its work. The person who fills this role will assume many of the leadership and administrative duties Pastor Brodbeck is filling currently, allowing him to focus more on the spiritual leadership and parish care components of his ministry.
