PASTOR'S REFLECTION

What are you giving up for Lent? That is a common question as we move closer to Ash Wednesday (February 22). Giving something up is a long standing tradition for many Christians. People have chosen to eliminate a wide variety of things: sweets, social media, alcohol, television and much more. Little children often try to convince Mom it would be good to give up vegetables. I usually spend time fasting during this season.

The tradition is meant to help us understand all that Christ gave up in order to come to earth. He left all the glory of heaven, the sinlessness of that environment, a place of unending praise to the Father. He gave up that, so we give up something.

I was recently challenged to switch my focus this Lent from "what I give up" to "what I receive because of this season." It is an interesting challenge. I receive the forgiveness of sin. I receive a home in heaven. I receive someone to help me through life's challenges. I receive peace, joy and love. This list goes on.

No matter your focus – giving up or receiving – Lent offers a time for us to focus intently on the price of our sin and the great lengths to which our God is willing to go in order to pay that price.

Below you will read of our plans for Lent. I pray you will join us in our focus on the Lamb of God.

BEHOLD THE LAMB!

When John the Baptist first saw Jesus, he told those around him "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). That verse will serve as our theme verse for our 2023 Lenten season. Throughout this very special time of year we will be encouraged to look closely at this Lamb of God and the great sacrifice He made for us.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday services on February 22. We will worship at noon and 7 p.m. Both services will include Holy Communion and the imposition of ashes. Sunday services will see the addition of a few items to help us in our time of worship, including the introduction of a new liturgy. We will be practicing that for the two weeks prior to Lent so that our time of transition will be smooth.

Thursday evening worship services on March 2, 9, 16 and 23 begin at 7 p.m. At each of these services worshippers will be offered the opportunity to be anointed with oil as a part of the communion experience. Then on Thursday, March 30, we will enjoy something totally different: a full Seder (Passover) meal, led by a Messianic Jew. We will be sharing more details about this as they become available.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday worship on April 2. On Maundy Thursday (April 6) and Good Friday (April 7) we will again worship at noon and 7 p.m. The Easter Egg hunt happens on Saturday, April 8 and Easter worship is celebrated on April 9. Regrettably there will be no Easter breakfast this year. Past years have shown us that many people enjoy sharing in the fellowship but getting people to help with the cleanup is very problematic.

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

The Adult Sunday School hour continues the series "One Minute After You Die" through February 19. Sam Poston is facilitating this fascinating look at heaven and eternal life. Don't miss the three remaining sessions during the first three weeks of this month.

MAX LUCADO

When that series concludes, Pastor Brodbeck facilitates another Right Now Media series titled "He Chose the Nails," featuring the teaching ministry of Max Lucado. Many of us have enjoyed Lucado's writings over the years, and this series offers us a chance to hear his spoken voice as he again wonderfully communicates God's truth.

In *He Chose the Nails*, a five-session video Bible study, Pastor Lucado examines the gifts that Christ gave at his crucifixion. These include not only the gift of the cross, but also the gift of the nails, and the empty tomb. The cross is rich with God's gifts of grace, and as we unwrap them, you will hear him whisper, "I did it just for you."

NEW MEMBERS' CLASS

Our next New Members' Class will be held on the afternoon on Sunday, February 5 from 3:00 – 5:00 p.m. An optional tour of the Grace facility will be offered following the class for anyone who may be interested.

"We call in a New Members' Class because we haven't thought of a better name," said Pastor Brodbeck. "Actually there is no commitment to join when you take the class. It is a way for people to become more acquainted with the Grace congregation and its priorities. Some who attend will choose to join; others will not. And both responses are fine."

Attendees will learn about our approach to discipleship, discover ways to get involved, learn about our long-term vision as well as our history as a congregation. Most importantly, the class will be structured so that the questions of those attending are answered.
