And throughout the month you will hear the testimonies of our congregation as we express how God has been "more than enough" for us. You will especially want to be present in worship on Sept. 17th as Terri and Steve Lininger, along with their daughter Jules Lemaster, join me for the morning message.

Here's a simple formula for us each to remember as we prayerfully approach September: My resources + God's grace = More Than Enough. I look forward to seeing how that plays out in your life.

Our Outreach ministries have been increasingly focused on serving our community and certainly in doing so we pray that we are able to engage the people whom we are serving as well. The evening begins at 6 p.m. with a meal around the Grace Family Table. Joni Erickson Tada who was paralyzed from her shoulders down in a diving accident at the age of 17, is an evangelical Christian writer, artist, and founder of Joni and Friends, a Christian ministry serving the disability community throughout the world. Even now at 73 years old, she continues to "praise her Savior, all the day long."

A few years ago, I was privileged to sing hymns with literally thousands of other voices in melodious harmony, all without any instruments. It was just voices singing together in harmony. It was beautiful and miraculous! We were being led by Joni Erickson Tada who was in her wheelchair on the stage and she was singing! Yes, she was leading us and singing! How could someone who is paralyzed from the shoulders down control her breathing, sing praises to God, and lead thousands? How is that possible? Of course, it's by God! Joni has said: "It is one thing to sing praise to God by yourself; It's quite another when Christian friends join in with harmony. God designed and created us to sing together."

How wonderful it is to share our story through song! Fanny J. Crosby, who was blind shared her story in the hymn, Blessed Assurance and the other hymns she wrote, in fact over 8,000 hymns! Grace is blessed with talented and dedicated volunteers who faithfully share the message of Jesus Christ in the Sanctuary Choir, Grace Notes Handbell and Handchime Choirs. When the Sanctuary was being renovated, the Choir and Grace Notes continued to provide musical offerings and adapt to the new space in the Community Center. They share the songs and story of Christ at Grace throughout the year and represented our church in the community at the Champion City Kings baseball game with the choir singing the National Anthem again this past summer.

The volunteers in our vocal and instrumental choirs enjoy coming together to rehearse, pray, and fellowship with each other as they give their God-given talents back to God throughout the year. The choirs look forward to being back together this fall and sharing their musical talents with the congregation. We are blessed by their dedication and grateful for the message in music. It is wonderful to see how all members- youth and adults, men and women come together to learn the music and praise their Savior in song, "all the day (and year) long."
