Discussion Starters

- 1. With whom does God make His covenant?
- 2. What specifically does God promise? Is the covenant offered in past, present or future tense?
- 3. What is the significance of the name change for Abram and Sarai?
- 4. In what way(s) is God's view of Abraham and Sarah different from their view of themselves? How is God's view of you different than the way you see yourself?
- 5. What does God require of Abram? What does He still require of us?
- 6. Do you think Ishmael was included in the covenant God made with Abram? Why or why not?

Romans 4:13-25

Discussion Starters

- 1. What do you learn about the relationship between the Law and faith from this text? Which was required of Abraham in order to uphold his end of the covenant?
- 2. What do you learn about faith from Abraham's example?
- 3. What is meant by this statement: "Where there is no law there is no transgression" (v. 15b)? How can this be so?
- 4. Are you "fully persuaded" that God has the power to do what He has promised to you? How do you define "fully persuaded?"

Mark 8:31-38

Discussion Starters

- 1. What four things does Jesus prophesy will happen to Him?
- 2. Why does Jesus react so strongly to Peter's objection?
- 3. How would you paraphrase what Jesus says in verse 34?
- 4. What might be an example of someone who "loses his life" and someone who "saves his life" for the sake of the gospel (v. 35)?
- 5. What does it mean to be ashamed of Jesus and His words? What then does it mean that the Son of Man will be ashamed?
