The friend had no church or faith orientation, so the "celebration" was held at a local bar. (The friend was a recovering alcoholic, so I thought the choice of venue was a bit odd.)

He told me how those gathered at the bar told a few stories and shared a few beers.

There was a lot of laughter, the volume of which grew as the beer consumption increased. When the party was over, he felt empty and sad and alone. But Sam's service was different somehow, a fact which he attributed to Jesus. Jesus makes all the difference, doesn't he?

Depending on when you read these words, we will either be just a few days past our Easter celebration or a few days before it. From whatever vantage point you have when you read these words, would you please take a moment to reflect on my new friend's simple-yet-powerful conclusion? Jesus makes all the difference.

#### From the Desk of the Executive Director

The first quarter of this year has really flown by. I am certainly much busier this year as we continue to grow my role here at Grace. If you haven't heard, my candidacy process went well, and I was formally accepted into the candidacy process to become an ordained Deacon in the NALC. I will work with our Bishop, Dan Selbo, to discern this role as I begin to move through the rest of the process. I plan to start classes this fall, and it will take 3-4 years for me to complete the education. Thank you so much for your prayers so far and continued prayers throughout this process are much appreciated.



I continue to work on bringing a new English as a Second Language program to Springfield. It has been a slow process, but we continue to gain interest from key people and make forward progress. Your prayers over this opportunity are also much appreciated, especially pray for us to raise up a program manager, to begin to secure funding, and for God to lead us to a decision on where and when to pilot the program.

#### **OMR to Focus on Senior Adult Ministry**

The Ohio Mission Region (OMR) of the North American Lutheran Church will hold its annual convocation on May 3-4 at St. Johns Lutheran Church in Grove City, OH. The Saturday portion of the convocation is dedicated to business meetings of both the OMR and our own Southwest Ohio Mission District (SOMD). The Grace Council appoints delegates to represent our congregation at those meetings.

But the sessions on Friday, May 3 are geared toward ministry development and are open to all interested individuals. This year's focus will be on ministering to senior adults. The guest resource person will be Pastor Brad Hales, Director of Church Planting and Aging Ministries for the NALC. In that role he helps start new congregations and house churches, assists churches in starting senior and middle age ministries, and using these age groups as a catalyst for outreach and renewal.

#### **Endowment Announces 2024 Grant**

The Grace Endowment Team is pleased to announce it will award up to \$19,841 in grants to qualifying ministries this spring. These funds are generated by the Grace Endowment Fund and represent a percentage of the earnings from calendar year 2023.

Award requests will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

It honors and glorifies God.

It cannot be included in the current year's ministry plan (budget)

It will strive to diversify the distribution across ministry areas

It will reflect God's love beyond the Grace congregation

It will encourage the growth and health of the Grace Endowment Fund.

If you have a ministry idea that meets these criteria, you are invited to apply for a grant. Application forms are available in the Grace office. These must be submitted by April 30.

The Grace Endowment Fund was established in 1999 as a way of extending the ministry of the church. The principal is never touched, so the fund continues to grow as more and more people contribute to it.
