Lectionary Bible Study For Sunday, March 24, 2024 (Palm Sunday)

Isaiah 50:1-11

Discussion Starters

- 1. What is God emphasizing with the rhetorical questions in verses 1-2?
- 2. Verses 4-9 are one of the four "Servant Songs" in Isaiah. How would you describe the servant's mission? What is his relationship to God?
- 3. What might cause the servant to be mistreated like this? (See Isaiah 28-9-10 and 30:9-11).
- 4. What might the prophet mean by those "in the dark" (v. 10)? How might the example of the servant encourage them?
- 5. Who are the people who "provide themselves with flaming torches?" What will happen to anyone who tries to find a solution apart from God?
- 6. Describe a time when you have been mistreated because of your faith.

Philippians 2:1-11

Discussion Starters

- 1. Based on what you read here, what issue(s) was the church in Philippi facing?
- 2. What does it mean to "consider others better than yourself?"
- 3. How does humility differ from "being a doormat?"
- 4. What do you think it was like for Jesus to leave heaven and become human?
- 5. How does this passage redefine what "success" looks like?
- 6. What would a church be like that practiced what Paul communicates in this passage?

Mark 11:1-19

Discussion Starters

- Jesus always does the unexpected. What was unexpected about the way He entered Jerusalem? In light of the response He received, what were the expectations of the crowds?
- 2. What do you find to be the most important aspect of the Triumphal Entry?
- 3. How does the story of the fig tree relate to the cleaning out of the Temple?
- 4. Why would the actions of the Temple market personnel cause Jesus to get anary?
- 5. How is your understanding of Jesus impacted by this display of anger?
