

Pastor's Reflection

This morning was a beautiful spring-like day. The temperatures were cold, but the sun was shining brightly. By noon, though, the sun had disappeared. The sky was grey. The breeze picked up. The forecasters say we might have an inch or more of snow before tomorrow morning. How quickly things have changed!

I've been thinking a lot about those quick changes lately. We all know people whose worlds were literally upended following a trip over a toy on the floor or a simple medical procedure that went awry or a phone call from an employer, and more. We can broaden it to other situations as well. For example, in our community, two neighboring congregations will now celebrate Lent and Easter minus a pastor who surprised them with an unanticipated resignation. The joy of anticipation is covered by a cloud. In one moment, the sun is shining; in the next the clouds roll in.

That is a good visual image for me as I work on my sermons for Lent. In my study of the texts, I see the growing clouds in the hearts of those disciples – and even on Jesus Himself. Gradually as Jesus and His followers move closer and closer to the cross the mood in the text gets gloomier and gloomier.

Yet in the midst of it all, the plan of God is being fulfilled. How do I communicate that truth in those sermons? How can I help my hearers to know that the SON still shines even when the SUN doesn't?

Let me encourage you this day to look for the SON shine even when there is little sunshine. The story doesn't end at the cross. There is an empty tomb to follow.

Shoes that Grow

Malawi Orphan Care Project, Inc. has announced a fundraising project to provide shoes for our orphans in Malawi. They are designed to last for years and will provide protection from hazards and infections that are present with bare feet.

The Shoe That Grows has 5 times the impact of an ordinary shoe because it expands five sizes and lasts for years. This adjustable

shoe is easy to clean and easy to use, has a compressed rubber sole, antibacterial synthetic upper, high-grade Velcro straps, and no mechanical parts or gears to break. The shoes are available in five sizes.

Without shoes, children are especially vulnerable to diseases and parasites that can cause illness and even death. Children who get sick miss school, can't help their families, and suffer needlessly. And since children's feet grow so quickly, they often outgrow donated shoes within a year, leaving them once again exposed to illness and disease.

The Shoe That Grows can change that

The shoes are manufactured in Kenya, and we hope to have the shipment arrive so that our July mission team can help with the distribution. Each pair of shoes costs \$20.

Lenten Worship in March


By the time you read this article we will be about one-third of the way through the Lenten season. With Easter (March 31) closing out the month, these next several weeks are fully focused on our journey with Jesus along "The Way."

In addition to our regular schedule of Sunday morning worship (at 8 a.m. and 10:45 a.m.), our Thursday midweek worship continues through March 21. Those services start at 7 p.m. and will contain a couple of different worship components. As a part of the Sacrament of Holy Communion, we will offer a time of anointing. The worship will also include the intoning of a psalm – something that is a part of our Lutheran heritage but not a regular worship practice.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on March 24. Warm up your arms so you are prepared to wave your palm branch to start that service. You might want to Google how to fold that branch into a lovely cross too.

On Maundy Thursday and on Good Friday we will worship at noon and 7 p.m. The Good Friday services will be identical. The evening Maundy Thursday service will include the Rite of First Communion for several of our young people. A reception to celebrate them will follow that service.

And remember to memorize our theme verse: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). It's one every Christian should know by heart.



Adult Sunday School in March

Starting February 28, Pastor Tom will facilitate a four-week course titled "Pillars of Lent." Based on teaching from the 6th chapter of Matthew, participants will focus on three spiritual disciplines that are central to the theme of this season: Prayer, Fasting and Giving. (You might remember those were the central themes of the Gospel reading on Ash Wednesday.)

We will begin with a two week look at fasting before spending one session each on prayer and almsgiving. The goal of the course will be more than informational. We hope to learn how these disciplines enhance our Lenten experience and serve as a foundation piece of our spiritual growth.

There will not be an Adult Sunday School class on either of the last two Sundays of the month. March 24 (Palm Sunday) is the spring congregational meeting and March 31 is Easter Sunday.
