- 2. How does being filled with the Spirit related to being a witness for Jesus?
- 3. What does Peter want to make sure the gather throng understands clearly about what they are observing?
- 4. Why does Peter quote the Old Testament (Joel 2:28-32) in his sermon?
- 5. What does it mean to "call upon" the name of the Lord?

Romans 8:22-27

Discussion Starters

- 1. What does the word "redemption" mean? In what way is adoption a good picture of our redemption?
- 2. Think about this passage in light of the persecution faced by Christians. How does that impact your understanding of this text?
- 3. Based on these verses, how would you describe the ministry of the Holy Spirit?
- 4. What is the difference between the hope of a Christian and wishful thinking?

John 15:26-27; 16:4-15

Discussion Starters

- 1. What do you learn about the Holy Spirit's role in the salvation process from these verses? What specifically will the Holy Spirit do?
- 2. How would the teachings of Jesus be helpful in the future for the disciples? How would the disciples be affected by what Jesus taught?
- 3. Define "convict."
- 4. How do you understand the phrase "He will guide you into all truth?" (see v. 13)
