

# **Grace NALC 20/20 Vision Campaign Update**



Our Grace members continue to be faithful to supporting our denomination's fundraising campaign. We continue to receive both pledged and unpledged dollars. Through the end of May we have taken in \$24,734 from the congregation.

Combined with the \$20,000 the Council put in initially, this brings our total collected through the end of March to \$44,734, towards our goal of \$60,000 by the end of 2025. We are praising God for this progress putting us at almost 75% just 5 months into our campaign. If we collect all that has been pledged, we will need another \$7,000 to hit our goal. We are in prayer that we might even exceed our goal. Continued thanks for your generosity.

I have extended VBS by one day and a half an hour to allow us more time for fun. Our family cookout will be Thursday, August 8th at 6:00PM


#### **From Roger Bentz**
