

Twenty-five years ago this congregation took a walk. Some of you were a part of that walk on that September day. I wasn't. I was in Springfield at the time and remember hearing about it. It is a powerful image, and an even better testimony.

Think about it ... A church with a 75-year history in one location senses the call of God to move a mile down the road. Think of all the memories and traditions in that one location that were left behind that day. All because God called them to take a walk with Him. I love it!

Do realize that you and I are continuing in that walk today? The journey is not over. In fact the journey didn't begin in that Sunday in September in 1999. It began on a Sunday in October in 1915 when a group of people under the leadership of Pastor Elmer Flack, a seminary student at Hamma School of Theology, felt the call of God to form a new Lutheran congregation on the northside of Springfield. Over the last 109 years, the steps of faith taken by the people and leadership of this congregation have been a testimony to their faithfulness and willingness to follow God wherever He leads.

This month we celebrate that heritage as we commemorate 25 years on St. Paris Pike. And we recommit ourselves to "walk on in Grace." What a great month this will be!

Festa: 3 Generation ESOL Program

The Warder Literacy Center and Nehemiah Foundation in conjunction with the work of our own Sandy Thompson are bringing a Family, 3 Generation Model ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) Program to Springfield to help meet the growing needs of our new neighbors.

The pilot for this program is set to begin September 19th and run for 12 weeks through December 12th. It will be on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at the High Street Church of the Nazarene from 6 to 8 pm.





An Invitation to Join in Song

The Sanctuary Choir, Grace Notes Handbells and the Handchimes Choirs are all accepting new members. September is a great time to join as the choirs traditionally come back together for a more regular schedule in the fall.





The **Sanctuary Choir** is a dedicated mixed vocal choir of SATB (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass) voices who rehearse most Wednesdays, 7:00-8:30 pm, to raise their voices in message and song during Sunday Worship throughout the year, mainly 10:45 am services, both services on most Festival services, Christmas Eve, selected mid-week services, and in the community. This friendly group has a family atmosphere, enjoying fellowship with each other

and are welcoming to new members. Adults and teens with a God-given talent for singing, matching pitch, and blending voices with others in choral part singing are invited to praise our Lord and Savior in the Sanctuary Choir.

Grace Notes Handbell Choir is an instrumental group that rings Schumerich handbells and welcomes adults and youth who read music or who have the ability to learn and are dedicated to practicing and ringing to the glory of God. Many times, the printed music will include special techniques, such as also playing



handchimes within the same song. Rehearsals are held on selected Wednesdays, 5:30-6:45 pm, and rings for services in various groupings, usually monthly throughout the year.

The instrumental **Handchimes Choir** welcomes participants of all ages and abilities who are interested in learning, practicing, and playing just one or two handchimes of the three-octave instrument. Participants do not need to read music and there are opportunities for younger elementary aged children to participate. Handchimers will have the opportunity to practice and play at special times during the year.

Grace NALC 20/20 Vision Campaign Update



Giving to this campaign remains steady. In July, Grace took in \$1,340 towards our campaign to support the NALC 20/20 Vision. \$1,270 of these dollars were pledged dollars and \$70 were unpledged dollars. This brings

our total collected through the end of July to \$46,417. Thank you for your continued generosity and commitment.

25th Anniversary Celebration

Grace will celebrate the 25th Anniversary of our current location on Sunday, September 29 with **ONE COMBINED SERVICE at 10 a.m.** This single service will allow us time to enjoy additional music, words of remembrance from former Pastor Dan Powell and a challenge message from Pastor Tom Brodbeck as we "Walk on in Grace."

The service will also be our Consecration Sunday service. Each worshipper present will be invited to the altar to share with God their Estimate of Giving for the 2025 budget and the dedication of their time and talents in service through the ministries of the church.

Estimate of Giving cards will be mailed to each home the third week of September. You should have already received your Time and Talent booklet. You will only need to return the center sheet from that booklet.

Following the single service there will be a church-wide potluck. Sign up sheets will be located in the narthex where you can RSVP and indicate what dish you will be bringing to the meal.

Adult Discipleship in September

September marks the beginning of the fall semester of discipleship opportunities at Grace. Chief among those is the return of our Wednesday night Grace Family Table and Adult FUEL study. Both start on September 4.

At 6 p.m. join your Grace Family around the table as we enjoy delicious food and wonderful fellowship. You can help out as the meal is prepared, by bringing a dessert to share, by assisting with the post-meal cleanup or perhaps volunteering to prepare the entire meal (with help from others). Do you have a specialty? We would all love to enjoy it with you.

Three or four times a year we would have an activity, in which you could spend time with your partner (think a "tea", game night, etc.). If your prayer partner plays a sport, is in a concert/play or any other organized activity and you would like to attend, that would be wonderful!
