

Pastor's Reflection

When Jesus stood before Pilate, the Roman governor asked an ageless question: "What is truth?" Faced with accusations and rumors, Pilate desperately wanted to know who and what to believe. He did not want to be wrong.

Over these last several weeks I have been asked that same ageless question multiple times: "Pastor, how am I supposed to know who and what to believe?" The question is good and necessary. Whenever I struggle with that same question personally I ask three questions.

First, who is my source? We get information from a host of people every day: Friends, news anchors, parents, social media. Some sources we quickly trust, and others we can quickly dismiss. As I ask this question, I am also asking myself "why would they say this?" and "what will they gain from it?" If I can discover their motive, it helps me decide if this source is credible.

My second question is "what evidence do they have?" When making a decision about truth related issues you want to find "primary evidence." That means I never want to hear someone told someone who heard it from someone else. If you "saw it" I am more like to believe than if you "heard It." Much of the turmoil in our community stems from things "heard" rather than things actually "seen."

PASTORS REFLECTION (CONT.)

My third question is "how much emotion does this stir in me?" If the answer is "a lot," I immediately back off. Why? Because strong emotions are a clue that I am being misled. Advertisers know this trick well, and we all have been victims of it.

Ultimately, though, as a Christian, I should be taking all of my questions to God in prayer. "Lord, what is true and how should I respond?" As James 1:5 puts it: "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask ... and it will be given to you."


Laurel Mission Trip

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL IN OCTOBER

Adult learners will gather in the Fellowship Hall each Sunday morning at 9:15 a.m. to continue "Growing in Grace." The month of October begins with a Breakfast Break (described more in another article) before moving into a newly created class that will run through the first Sunday in November.

"Elephants, Donkeys and the Lamb" will offer a biblical perspective on the Christian's role and responsibility in the current political climate, with a reminder of where our true citizenship and hope lies.

"We recognize this is a contentious subject," Pastor Tom Brodbeck notes. "But it is an important one for Christians, and especially so in a climate where matters of faith and politics become so intermingled that it is hard to differentiate the two. I am promising a non-partisan but pro-Jesus class."

REFORMATION SUNDAY

On October 31, 1517 Professor Martin Luther posted 95 theses (debating points) on the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenberg Germany, intending to promote a conversation about elements of theology and church practice he felt had strayed from Biblical teaching. Instead of conversation, Luther unintentionally launched what has become known as the Protestant Reformation.

Luther was both a respected professor at nearby Wittenberg University, as well as the assistant pastor of the Castle Church. Luther chose October 31 because it was the day before All Saints' Day. The Castle Church's front door opened on a main street of the city, and it was a good place to post a notice for public viewing.

Luther knew that on the next day, November 1 — All Saints' Day — the church would be filled with worshipers, many of whom were educated and literate. His act of posting his *Ninety-Five Theses* on the door was the equivalent of publishing a journal article, taking out a newspaper ad, or putting up an Internet website today.

Our worship on October 27 will include hymns and prayers written by Luther to commemorate this foundational event in our denomination's history. You are encouraged to wear the color red as a part of this celebration.

THE GRACE MUSIC ROOM

The renovations of the Music Room are complete and were in time to celebrate the church's 25th Anniversary here in Grace's present location. The Choir uses the Music Room for weekly Wednesday rehearsals, warm-ups before services, and after services to return items, such as music, folders, and choir robes. Through the years other groups have also met in the room. So, the Music Room has had a great deal of use during the past 25 years.

Funds from the Grace Endowment were requested by Barbara Blackburn, choir director to make the improvements. Last year the worn carpeting was replaced on the tiered risers and provided a safer and a dramatic difference to the room. This year the Endowment request written with assistance from Mark Grimes, was granted and provided the funds to upgrade the chairs in the Music Room. The existing chairs, purchased 25 years ago from the Sauder Company in Ohio are singing posture appropriate, comfortable, and still very sturdy. But, through the years, the fabric upholstery and foam backing had been damaged or deteriorated with age. Replacement seats and backs for the existing chairs could be purchased and at a substantial cost savings. Five additional chairs were also part of the request for funds to accommodate a growing number of participants in the choir.

The following choir members volunteered their time and labor to disassemble and reassemble the chairs with the new replacement seats and backs. THANK YOU to Neal (who coordinated the project) & Barbara Blackburn, Victoria Barnes, Carolyn Clifton, David & Cathy Holl, Jim Kincaid (who had the honor of sitting in the 1st completed chair which he completed!), Sonya Ryhal, Kay Reed, and Barbara Romaca. Thanks, also to Victoria Barnes for completing the room with the beautiful wall décor.

Enjoy all the photos from the chairs upgrade. But, as they say, "it's better in person." Everyone is invited to come, peek in, and experience the "new" Music Room for yourself. (And if you'd like to sing in the room, you can join our choir. Just speak to Barbara... we'll save you a seat!)
