#### Pastor's Reflection

Will we have a white Christmas this year? Forecasters seem to be projecting more rain than snow, so I don't know what to expect... although I'm fairly confident Christmas will come. What do you expect as we approach this special time of the year?

One of the great carols sung during the Advent season is "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus" (LBW #30). This hymn was written in 1744 by Charles Wesley. At that time, Wesley was burdened by the situation of children (particularly orphans) in the areas around him. He was also deeply concerned about the widening class divide in Great Britain (reminiscent of our own nation's divisions in the areas of politics, race, and social issues). Burdened by all of this, he passionately wanted Jesus to come back and set the world right. You can almost hear him cry out "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus."

The lyrics of this hymn focus on God choosing to give a Messiah to the world in the form of the baby Jesus and speaks of the longing of all people for a Messiah who would set them free from the burden of sin – something different from what most people expected.

Come, thou long-expected Jesus, Born to set thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; Let us find our rest in thee.

Israel's strength and consolation, Hope of all the earth thou art,

Dear Desire of ev'ry nation, Joy of every longing heart.

#### Advent 2024

#### Great Expectations

As the carol suggests, "It's the most wonderful time of the year." And so we welcome Advent 2024, which begins on Sunday, December 1. Our theme will be "Great Expectations."

This theme shares its title with the 13<sup>th</sup> (and arguably the best) novel of Charles Dickens (whose prior work reappears every Christmas holiday season as we relive the tale of Ebeneezer Scrooge and Tiny Tim).

The Dickens's version of *Great Expectations* is full of extreme imagery—poverty, prison ships and chains, and fights to the death. It has a colorful cast of characters and its themes include wealth and poverty, love and rejection, and the eventual triumph of good over evil. Ultimately Dickens points us toward "a legacy to come." And though not a Christian work per se, the novel is also concerned with questions relating to conscience and moral regeneration, as well as redemption through love. All of this is enough to make you think of the biblical Christmas story, isn't it?

Our version of *Great Expectations* will, of course, be based on the Scriptures (not on the paragraphs of the Dickens' novel). We will explore how Jesus fulfilled the expectations of the Old Testament prophets, even if He was not what the people of His day expected. There were so many "Great Expectations!"

Our Sunday worship services (at 8 and 10:45 a.m. on each of the month's five weeks) will be supplemented by three Thursday contemplative services at 7 p.m. Pastor Tom will be joined in the chancel by our seminarians Michelle Kouse and Sandy Thompson for these services.

We will also worship on Christmas Eve with our traditional candlelight services at 6:30 p.m. and 9 p.m. The earlier service will feature the children's stable processional, and both services will be filled with beautiful music.

Come expectantly as we worship the Baby of Bethlehem!



### Women of Grace are Encouraged to Register to be a Secret Sister by December 15

Grace's Secret Sister program returns on January 1, 2025. A Secret Sisters program at a church is a ministry where participants anonymously encourage their assigned Secret Sister through prayers, cards and a small gift at the end of the program on the designated "reveal" date. It's a great way to get to know someone new at Grace!

Our time period at Grace for Secret Sisters in the coming year, begins on Jan. 1, 2025, and ends on May 5, 2025. Participants will be assigned to a "sister" via US mail before the end of December 2024, so any woman from Grace, who wants to participate, needs to sign up by December 15.

# Walking Through the New Testament in 2024

As the year comes to a close, also does our "Bible Reading Plan  $5 \times 5 \times 5$ ". The  $5 \times 5 \times 5$  plan was to be a helpful aid into how all could discipline our approach to reading the New Testament.

The first "5" was to read 5 minutes a day. (OK, I can do that.)
The second "5" was to read 5 days a week. (OK, I can do that, too.)

But, I had a hard time remembering what the third "5" was to help with. After referring back to the reading plan, it stood for 5 ways to dig deeper into our reading. When I set aside my 5 minutes for reading, I don't just read. I need to concentrate on the five suggestions for digging deeper as the plan suggests.

- 1. Underline and highlight key words.
- 2. Put the reading into your own words.
- 3. Ask and answer questions of your self about what you just read.
- 4. Capture the big idea and understand why.
- 5. Personalize the meaning.

(I found that if I used all of these 5 points, I needed to read much longer that 5 minutes!)

After using this approach for reading the New Testament, it will be a great approach to READ THE OLD TESTAMENT!
