"But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Matthew 24:36)

## **Commonly Used Terms**

- Revelation
- Apocalypse
  - Sensational in its descriptions
  - The present is bleak; the future is wonderful
  - Heavily coded language
  - Not necessarily mean to be taken in a factual sense

## **Commonly Used Terms**

- Millenium
  - Pre-millennial
  - Post-millennial
  - A-millennial
  - Pan-millenial
- Tribulation



## **Symbolism of the Numbers**

- 1 = Unity, uniqueness
- 2 = Strength
- 3 = Symbol of the divine
- 6 = Evil (falls short of perfect)
- 7 = Sacred
- 10 = Completeness, whole

## **Symbolism of the Numbers**

12 = Religion (12 tribes, disciples)

70 = Very sacred (7 x 10)

 $144 = A \text{ multiple of } 12 (12 \times 12)$ 

1000 = Ultimate completeness (10 x 10 x 10)

We will see other non-numeric symbols throughout the book. These are meant to confuse those on the "outside."

**FOUR** visions inside of ONE revelation

- 1. Vision of the Son of Man (chs 1-3)
- 2. Vision of Heaven (chs 4-19)
- 3. Vision of the End of the Age (chs 19-20)
- 4. Vision of the New Heaven and New Earth (chs 21-22)

## Introduction (1:1-3)

- · A "revelation"
- From God → Jesus → Angel → John → the readers
- Purpose: Must "soon take place"
- Dual testimony (two are required)
- Blessing on the readers

# **Greetings (1:4-8)**

- Typical greeting (grace and peace)
- The letter is from John
- Note descriptions of God and Jesus in the rest of the chapter
- Note 7 churches and 7 spirits

# **Authorship & Commission**

- John is the author (your brother)
- Patmos an island used for political prisoners and criminals
- Jesus speaks to commission him
- Seven specific churches



### Vision of Christ (1:12-16)

- Seven candlesticks (the seven churches)
- One like the Son of Man
  - Priestly garb
  - White hair (wisdom)
  - Eyes of fire (omniscience)
  - Bronze feet (strength)
  - Voice like many waters (authority)
  - Seven stars (the angels/pastors of the churches)
  - Shining face (Shekinah; majesty)
  - Two-edged sword (judgment)

## Vision Interpreted (1:17-20)

- Do not be afraid
- The living one
- The holder of the keys of death and Hades
- Commission restated
- Mystery revealed
