Historicist Approach

Unsealing of the scroll represents the fall of the Roman Empire



Preterist Approach

Unsealing of the scroll represents the fall of the Roman Empire



Futurist Approach

Rapture of the church and the start of the Great Tribulation



Idealist Approach

This all describes how God deals with humanity – over and over again.



An Invitation

Read Revelation 4:1-2a An open door into heaven An unidentified yet familiar "voice" (1:10) Sounds like a trumpet "In the Spirit" Invitation Come and see (John 1:39)

The Throne Room

<u>Read Revelation 4:2b-6a</u> Main Throne 24 Other Thrones Set in a circle around the main throne

The Throne Room SITTING ON THE MAIN THRONE "Someone" Appearance of jasper and carnelian Circled by an emerald rainbow Emitting flashes of lightning, rumblings and peals of thunder Seven lamps are in front (Spirit of God)

Crystal sea

SITTING ON THE 24 THRONES •24 Elders Dressed in white Crowns of gold Not heavenly creatures, but humans

The Throne Room

The Four Living Creatures

Read Revelation 4:6b-8 In the center and around the throne Covered with eyes Six wings Facial appearance was different Constant in worship

Heavenly Worship

Read Revelation 1:9-11 The 24 Elders follow their lead Proclaim ... Worthiness of God

Introducing the Scroll

Read Revelation 5:1-4 Scroll with double-sided writing In the right hand of the throne-sitter Sealed with seven seals Can only be opened by one who is worthy

Introducing the Lamb

Read Revelation 5:5-7

- One elder proclaims the Lamb "worthy"
- Lion of Judah and Root of David
- Triumphant
- Appears to have been slain
- Found standing at the center of the throne
- Seven horns and seven eyes

More Worship

Read Revelation 5:8-14 Prompted when the Lamb takes the scroll All of heaven worships!! Seven bowls of incense Everyone had a harp Everyone sang a new song (3 songs total)

Song 1: Elders and Creatures

Themes of their song He was sacrificed He redeemed us with His blood He made us into a kingdom and serving priests We too reign

Song 2: Thousands of Angels

Seven elements of praise:

PowerWealthWisdomMightHonorGloryBlessing

Song 3: All Creation

Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
