# **Last Week**

- **We heard the sounding of the first six trumpets**
  - Four happened in rapid-fire fashion
  - Two followed over extended periods of time
- **We met the “Morning Star” angel and his host of demon locusts**
- **We saw that people still preferred evil**



## **Trumpet #6 (part 2)**

- **This lesson begins with the second half of the 6<sup>th</sup> trumpet**
  - Another angel with a little scroll
  - The two “witnesses”
  - Glimpse of the “beast”



# **The Angel and the Little Scroll**

**Read Revelation 10:1-11**

- **The “mighty angel”**
  - Comes down from heaven
  - Robed in a cloud
  - Rainbow about his head
  - Face like the sun
  - Legs like fiery pillars

# **The Angel and the Little Scroll**

**Read Revelation 10:1-11**

- **The “mighty angel”**
  - Holding a little scroll (it was open)
  - Planted one foot in the sea and one on land
  - Voice like the roar of a lion



# **The Angel and the Little Scroll**

## **Read Revelation 10:1-11**

- **The voices of the seven thunders**
  - Note John 12:28-29
  - Note Psalm 29
- **John is told to NOT write down what he hears in the thunder. Why?**

# **The Angel and the Little Scroll**

## **Read Revelation 10:1-11**

- **The angel's oath**
  - Raising of the right hand
  - Swearing by him who lives forever and ever
  - No more delay ... once the seventh trumpet sounds
  - The final trumpet will accomplish the mystery of God (Rom. 16:25; 1 Cor. 2:7)



# **The Angel and the Little Scroll**

## **Read Revelation 10:1-11**

- **John takes the scroll**
  - Eats it (internalizes it)
  - Tastes sweet but soon turns sour
- **The scroll ... what does it contain?**
  - The rest of Revelation?
  - The gospel message?

# **Introducing the Two Witnesses**

## **Read Revelation 11:1-14**

- **John measures the Temple**
  - Measuring is usually a symbol of justice or judgment
  - The “Gentiles” (pagans) will “trample” the holy city for 42 months



# **Introducing the Two Witnesses**

## **Read Revelation 11:1-14**

- **Power given to two witnesses**
  - “My” power
  - Power to prophesy
  - Limited to 1260 days
  - Clothed in sack cloth
  - They cannot be harmed during the 1260 days

# **Introducing the Two Witnesses**

## **Read Revelation 11:1-14**

- **Power given to two witnesses**
  - Two witnesses required in a court to establish guilt
  - Identified as:
    - Two olive trees
    - Two lampstands



# **Introducing the Two Witnesses**

## **Read Revelation 11:1-14**

- **First appearance of the Beast**
  - Rises from the Abyss
  - Kills the witnesses
  - Bodies left in “Sodom and Egypt” (where the Lord was crucified)
  - 3 ½ days they were denied burial

# **Introducing the Two Witnesses**

## **Read Revelation 11:1-14**

- **Resurrection of the witnesses**
  - 3 ½ days later they are resurrected
  - Recalled to heaven in a cloud
  - Judgment breaks loose

# The Seventh Trumpet

## Read Revelation 11:15-19

- 7<sup>th</sup> seal brought silence; 7<sup>th</sup> trumpet brings loud worship
- The descriptions of a temple in heaven and the presence of the ark are likely symbolic since there is no need of either.
