Discussion Starters

- 2. What is the "light" and "darkness" referred to in this text?
- 3. Reading verses 4-22 is like watching a parade. What do the people see, and what should that mean to them?
- 4. Why does God bestow all of this wealth on His people?

Ephesians 3:1-12

Discussion Starters

- 1. What is the mystery Paul talks about? Why was it a mystery?
- 2. What is Paul's role in this mystery? Where does the church fit into it?
- 3. How is this mystery applicable to us today?
- 4. Why does Paul refer to himself as the "least" of all God's people? Is he being hard on himself?

Matthew 2:1-12

Discussion Starters

- 1. Why was it important for Jesus to be born in Bethlehem?
- 2. What do the star, the Magi, their gifts, their worship, the hostility of Herod and role of prophecy tell you about the significance of Jesus?
- 3. What do we know about the Magi, based on this text?
- 4. Why did Herod want to know when Jesus was born? Why was his response to the birth announcement so much different than the response of the Magi?
