As I write these words, work has begun in our Grace garden. Winter growth is being removed, and soil is being turned in preparation for the planting of this year's crop of vegetables. It is another sure sign of spring! Soon you will see the new growth appearing, followed closely by the reappearance of our Grace Harvest Table.

I am reminded of Mark 4:28, a verse known as the "all by itself" principle. It reads: "The earth produces by itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear." This verse is included in teaching that describes what happens when the good seed of the gospel is sown. In short, God makes it grow.

We can work hard to plant the seed properly, water it, weed it and care for it. But ultimately God is the One who makes it grow. If you want a living illustration of what God does in the heart of a person who seeks Him, just watch those 11,000 square feet on the north end of our property.

As we move nearer and nearer to Easter Sunday, we continue to plant the seeds of faith wherever we have opportunity. Some will fall on hard, stony soil. Some will get caught up in the thistles of life. But in others, the seed will take root and God will make it grow.

I encourage you to sow the seed faithfully, especially in this month of April with Easter just ahead. People need Jesus. Even good people need Jesus. And as you sow, invite them to come to church with you.

LENTEN AND EASTER SERVICES

The month of April is the "home stretch" for our congregation as we focus our eyes on the Garden of the Empty Tomb and our Easter Sunday morning celebration. The month is filled with great opportunities to worship and rejoice in the good news of the resurrection.

Thursday evening worship services will be held on April 3 and April 10, with Pastors Larry Bannick and Tom Brodbeck preaching on those dates. Each of these 7 p.m. services is preceded by a Soup Supper fellowship time at 6 p.m.

Holy Week (April 13 - 20) begins with our traditional waving of the palm branches on Palm Sunday. Limber up your arms for that morning's festivities.

Our Maundy Thursday services will be held at noon and 7 p.m. on Thursday, April 17. Both services will include Holy Communion and the somber stripping of the altar. The evening service, though, will feature four of our Grace young people receiving their First Communion. We will host a light reception in their honor following the benediction that evening.

Good Friday brings a special treat. The noon and 7 p.m. services that day (April 18) will feature a pageant style presentation of the Stations of the Cross. Written by Jon Joyce (a now deceased member of Grace) and directed by Terry Ankenman, this moving presentation will take place in our sanctuary. This will be a "don't miss!" time of worship.

Saturday is the annual Grace Easter Egg Hunt at 10 a.m. More than 2,000 eggs will be scattered for the children to find. Grace members are invited to fill those eggs. You can pick up and return them from the boxes in the narthex.

Easter Sunday services are held at the normal times of 8 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. Both services are filled with music and the Gospel. There is no Sunday School that day.

As always, we are confident that Grace members will shine at what we always do well: make our guests feel welcome and loved. It looks to be a great month!

ENDOWMENT ANNOUNCES 2025 GRANTS

The Grace Endowment Team is pleased to announce it will award up to \$19,278 in grants to qualifying ministries this spring. These funds are generated by the Grace Endowment Fund and represent a percentage of the earnings from calendar year 2024.

Award requests will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- It honors and glorifies God.
- It cannot be included in the current year's ministry plan (budget)
- It will strive to diversify the distribution across ministry areas
- It will reflect God's love beyond the Grace congregation
- It will encourage the growth and health of the Grace Endowment Fund.

If you have a ministry idea that meets these criteria, you are invited to apply for a grant. Application forms are available in the Grace office. These must be submitted by April 30, 2025.

The Grace Endowment Fund was established in 1999 as a way of extending the ministry of the church. The principal is never touched, so the fund continues to grow as more and more people contribute to it. Here is a little background about our Meals-on-Call team...

Years ago, when Tom and I joined Grace, *Meals-on-Call* was facilitated by our precious, Ellen Whitaker, who has since moved to heaven. She was a caring facilitator who led by example through her generosity of time, meals and gratitude for those who served under her.

Grace continues to have a small, devoted group of volunteers who prepare and deliver meals to members who are in need. This includes people with recent surgeries, illnesses, new babies, and other times when requested/needed. People are asked to reach out to the office if they are interested in receiving a few meals. Sometimes, members of our team become aware and do the asking. It's all part of God's Plan.

I was recently asked to describe a meal I would provide. I like to take fruit or salad, along with a main course. At times dessert is prepared also, but not always. Honestly, I am not a great cook, so I have a few meals I regularly turn to. (God has such a sense of humor placing me as the facilitator of our team.) Here are two examples.

Meal #1

Homemade chicken noodle soup

Crackers

Fresh fruit or blueberry muffins

Meal #2

Ham, green beans, and potatoes

Orange slices

Corn bread or biscuits

Thankfully, we have a small budget line for volunteers to turn in their receipts and receive reimbursement. Seldom do our volunteers do that, but it is there and encouraged. To help things run smoothly, I generally sign up for the first meal. I find out allergies, preferences, etc., and set up the schedule for delivery. This allows me to find the home and guide our volunteers to where they need to go. There are months we do not have any requests, but when we do, it is generally for a week of meals. I will send an e-mail or phone call to our team members to see who is available to provide a meal and a schedule is made up.
