Isaiah 43:16-21

Discussion Starters

- 1. What historical event does God (through the prophet Isaiah) refer to as he begins this particular text?
- 2. Why does God want the people to forget about this event? What is the purpose of reflecting on things God has done in the past?
- 3. What "new thing" is God doing for the people of Israel? What new thing is God doing in your life? In the lives of people you see around you?
- 4. What does God mean by the imagery of "streams in the desert?" How would this be "good news" to the people who heard (and who hear it now)?

Philippians 3:4-14

Discussion Starters

- 1. What reasons did Paul have to be confident about his standing with God (prior to his conversion)? What opinion did he have of those reasons now? Why the change?
- 2. What faulty things do people today rely on to give them confidence about their relationship with God?
- 3. Using the imagery of a track race, where does Paul picture himself in his spiritual life? Where are you in your race?
- 4. What prize is he striving for? How is he going to reach it?
- 5. How would you complete the sentence Paul begins in verse 13: "But one things I do: ."

John 12:1-11

Discussion Starters

- 1. How does Jesus interpret Mary's actions? Why do you suppose Mary did it?
- 2. Why does Judas object to Mary's actions?
- 3. How does verse 8 apply to the people in that room? How does it apply to us?
- 4. Do you think Jesus knew that Judas was stealing from the treasury? If so, why did he allow that to continue?
- 5. Why would the chief priests want to kill Lazarus?
