Acts 5:17-32

Discussion Starters

- 1. Who are the Sanhedrin? What was their role in Jewish life? Why were they so opposed to what the Apostles were doing?
- 2. If you were one of the imprisoned Apostles, how would you have felt during the events of vv. 18-21? How would you have felt if you were one of the religious leaders when they arrived the following morning?
- 3. Why is Peter so direct in his response to the religious leaders (vv. 29-32)? How is this different from Peter's way of operating before the crucifixion? Why the difference?
- 4. What does this passage teach about our Christian responsibility to those in authority over us?

Revelation 1:4-8

Discussion Starters

- 1. What is significant about the references to God in verses 4 and 8? What is the significance of the titles given to Jesus in verse 5?
- 2. What three things does Christ do for us?
- 3. Who are the seven churches? What is their significance?
- 4. What clues do you get from these verses about the meaning of this book (see especially v. 7)?

John 20:19-31

Discussion Starters

- 1. When did the events of this passage happen?
- 2. Three times Jesus tells the disciples "peace be with you." Why are they afraid now? How does the triple statement of Jesus address their fears?
- 3. What was the purpose of Jesus' breathing on the disciples?
- 4. How does Jesus deal with Thomas' doubt? What is significant about Thomas' response? Why do you suppose Thomas was absent at the first appearance of Jesus?
- 5. For Thomas, seeing was believing. What was foundational for your belief in Christ?
- 6. How would you describe the purpose for John's gospel?
