Acts 9:1-20

Discussion Starters

- 1. What did we know about the Apostle Paul before this point in his story?
- 2. What do you think Paul was thinking during his three days of blindness and fasting? How was his life changed during that period of time?
- 3. Paul obviously had a dramatic experience that resulted in his journey of faith. How would you describe the process by which you began to follow Christ?
- 4. Since Jesus had already appeared directly to Saul, why was it necessary for Him to send Ananias? What impact do you think Ananias had on Saul?

Revelation 5:11-14

Discussion Starters

- 1. Put this scene from heaven into your own words. How would you describe what was happening?
- 2. What is the significance of the scroll? The seals?
- 3. Who is the only one deemed worthy to open the book and break the seals? How do you know the identity of that individual?
- 4. Why is this scene an important one for Christians to remember?
- 5. What, for you, would be the best part of the worship experience described in this text?

John 21:1-19

Discussion Starters

- 1. Why did the disciples go fishing?
- 2. Why did they count the fish? Is there a special significance in the number?
- 3. Why did Jesus pose the same question and issue the same commission to Peter three times?
- 4. What does this passage teach about restored relationships after we fail miserably in our journey of faith?
- 5. Why did Jesus fix breakfast for His disciples?
- 6. Where do you go to "get away"? How does God meet you in that place?
