Pastor's Reflection

Just as I sat down to type these words my cell phone pinged with a scam message. It looked legitimate at first, coming from a name I knew from years ago, asking how I was. I fell for that part and responded. The follow-up text made me aware that my friend's account had been hijacked. It was that easy.

The Scriptures teach us that the devil works in that kind of sly and subtle way. In 2 Corinthians 11:14 we read: "Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light." This means that the devil deceives people by appearing good, truthful and loving, qualities that are desired by God, but they are all a scam. They are designed to trick us and lead us away from the truth.

What's the cure? Well, when it comes to my phone, I have to be aware of the possibility that someone with bad motives may be lurking nearby, and I need to learn as much as I can about the tricks used by such people. Similarly, I need to know how the devil works, and how God works too. That only happens as I read God's Word and as I spend time in the fellowship of the community of faith.

Our world is filled with misleading information. Most of us are sharp enough to recognize the really bad stuff, but we are all susceptible to the masquerades of the devil. It sounds right, sounds good, looks good and may even be fun! But if you partake, you will eventually find out you are another victim.

My story ends well. I quickly cut off the conversation and blocked the intruding "friend." And then I prayed ... for my friend whose account was hacked, for the person trying to mislead me, and for all of you.



Have you ever been asked when you first came to know Jesus? I can't answer this question with a specific place or date. I was raised in the Lutheran church, baptized, attended Sunday School and worship services with few exceptions, VBS each summer, completed a rigorous confirmation, and read the Bible and Small Catechism. I did all the things that gave me knowledge of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I knew the Lord as my Savior. But knowing and truly being in relationship with Him are not the same.

Throughout my life, Christ has never ceased calling me closer to Him. Through the valleys, I am often reminded He is always present. Like Proverbs 3:5-6, He teaches me to trust in Him with all my heart and lean not on my own understanding, but on Him.
