
I write this reflection on my first official day back in my Grace office following my recent knee replacement surgery. It is good to be back. I received scores of "get well" cards from you all, and I am quite grateful for them and the sentiments they expressed.

One of the things I am learning in rehab is that I have developed some very unhelpful habits over the years. In order to compensate for (or avoid) some of the pains caused by this bad knee these habits have become second nature to me. I don't even realize I am doing them. Thus, my physical therapists are coaching me through standing and sitting, walking across the floor and climbing the stairs. "You're doing it again," is a phrase I've heard them say repeatedly.

When Moses was coaching the children of Israel about how to walk with God in the days before they finally entered the Promised Land, he urged them to develop the habits that would make their walk successful. He suggested exercises that would impress new and good habits into their lives. But history showed that they got lazy and reverted to their old ways. Read more about it in Deuteronomy 6.

We are like them, aren't we? I am. As I sat down in my chair to type these words, I realized that I had once again sat down incorrectly. How easy it is to rely on those bad habits! So I stood up and sat down again and again and again. I need to get it right. I want to get it right! Both physically and spiritually.

Two ministries in which I serve bring me great joy:

Kairos is a 3½-day prison ministry focused on sharing Christ's love and forgiveness with incarcerated men and women, as well as prison staff. The name Kairos means "God's time." This ministry helps deepen faith, change hearts, and encourage better choices, which in turn reduces violence and repeat offenses. Serving on a Kairos team fills me with joy as I see lives transformed and faith renewed.

The Walk to Emmaus is a 72-hour spiritual retreat that renews discipleship and strengthens churches. Participants (pilgrims) spend time in reflection, worship, fellowship, and small groups. It brings me joy to witness pilgrims and team members alike grow in faith and commit to bringing Christ's love to their families, workplaces, and communities.

The next Men's Emmaus Walk will be in the spring. Please pray with me that the joy of Jesus will be deeply felt by everyone involved — that their joy may be complete.

Joy is a gift we can offer — and it can change lives.

James 1:2-3

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance

Because trials aren't meaningless—they have a purpose. They test and strengthen our faith, just as fire refines gold. Every challenge we endure with trust in God shapes us into who He created us to be.

True joy isn't the absence of problems; it's the presence of God and the confidence that He is working in our situation. When we understand that hardship produces perseverance and spiritual maturity, we can see our trials not as obstacles, but as opportunities for growth.
