Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

Discussion Starters

- 1. What does this text tell you about Habakkuk, his historical situation and the current crises he faces?
- 2. To whom is he complaining? Is his attitude sinful?
- 3. What "revelation" is Habakkuk to write down?
- 4. How are the righteous to live? What does that mean?
- 5. How is the way of the righteous different from other people?
- 6. Compare Habakkuk 2:4 with Romans 1:16-18 and Galatians 3:10-14. How does the Apostle Paul use this passage from Habakkuk to speak a new word to the Christians of his day?

2 Timothy 1:1-14

Discussion Starters

- 1. What do you learn here about Timothy's faith story? In what way(s) is Timothy's story similar to or different from your faith story?
- 2. What is a sincere faith?
- 3. What does it mean to "fan into flame the gift of God?"
- 4. What might cause Timothy to be "ashamed" of the gospel? What does that mean? What might tempt you to be ashamed as well?
- 5. What weakness in Timothy is suggested by this text? How does Paul tell him to counteract that weakness?
- 6. What is the "good deposit?" How are we to guard it?

Luke 17:1-10

Discussion Starters

- 1. Who is Jesus referring to in verse 1? What might be an example of someone causing another to sin?
- 2. How do we practically live out the teaching of verses 3-4 without making matters worse, or letting people who don't deserve it to get "off the hook" without punishment?
- 3. What inspired the disciples to ask for an increase in their faith? What does such a request mean?
- 4. What does Jesus mean by His teaching in vv. 7-10?
- 5. Do you really believe that a Christian today can cause a mulberry tree to be moved?
