Discussion Starters

- 1. How would you describe Namaan before he was healed? After?
- 2. What did it take for Namaan to confess there was no other God except our God?
- 3. Why does Namaan become angry (v. 11)?
- 4. Why are Namaan's servants so persuasive in getting Namaan to follow the direction of Elisha?
- 5. What promises of God do you think are "too easy" or "too good to be true?"
- 6. Why does Namaan take so much money with him when he goes to see Elisha?

2 Timothy 2:1-15

Discussion Starters

- 1. How is Timothy to ensure that the Gospel message lives on beyond him?
- 2. What do the examples of a soldier, farmer and athlete teach us about living the Christian life?
- 3. In spite of his suffering, what keeps Paul from giving up? What has kept you going during times of suffering?
- 4. Verses 11-13 are likely one of the early hymns of the church. What points of theology do you see in those verses?
- 5. What do you learn in these verses about the cost of discipleship? What role do suffering and endurance play in matters of faith?
- 6. What does it mean to "rightly divide the word of truth?"

Luke 17:11-19

Discussion Starters

- 1. What would life have been like for a leper? Why would healing have been cause for gratitude?
- 2. At what point in the story line were these men healed? Did all ten remain "healed" or just the one who gave thanks?
- 3. Why does Jesus send these ten men to the priest?
- 4. Why did the nine decide not to go back to say "thank you" to Jesus? Were they wrong for not doing so?
- 5. Why is it significant that the one who returned was a Samaritan?
