### Jeremiah 31:31-34

#### Discussion starters

- 1. What is a covenant?
- 2. How is the new covenant different from the old covenant, according to this text?
- 3. Why did God need to make a new covenant with his people?
- 4. What does it mean that "they will all know me" (verse 34)? How will they know him?
- 5. What does it mean that God "will remember their sins no more" (verse 34)?

# Romans 3:19-28

#### **Discussion Starters**

- 1. Why would this be an important text to read on Reformation Sunday?
- 2. What is the purpose (function) of the Law according to this text? Does the author (Paul) consider the Law to be useless now that Christ has been resurrected?
- 3. In what ways would this passage have been a major shift in thinking for the first readers?
- 4. In what ways does this passage break down barriers between Jews and Gentiles?

# John 8:31-36

#### **Discussion Starters**

- 1. Why would this be an important text to read on Reformation Sunday?
- 2. What characteristic of discipleship does Jesus identify in this passage? What is the outcome of having that particular characteristic?
- 3. Put verse 36 into your own words. What does it mean to be "free?" Free from what?
- 4. What differences does Jesus identify between "sons" and "slaves?"
