I have just started to read a new book titled "In Search of God's Will." So far, so good. I am reading it for a Book Club I participate in, but it might make an appearance in some future Sunday School course offering.

In these early chapters the author, Trevor Hudson, is distinguishing between the "general will" of God (what all Christians are to do – like loving our neighbors) and the "specific will" God has for each of our lives. This latter category includes such things as "what career to follow, whom to marry, where to reside, when to retire" and such.

Being able to discern God's specific will for my life requires that I know and hear God's voice. In John 10, Jesus describes how sheep know the voice of their shepherd and will not follow any other voice. We need that same awareness.

We hear a lot of voices in our world today, each clamoring for our ear. Many of them try to out-shout every other voice that is speaking. To which voice do we listen? Sometimes it is hard to know.

But as the author reminds us from the story of Elijah, our God usually speaks in a gentle whisper." Go back and read that wonderful Biblical story in 1 Kings 19:1-18. will be leaving with us at that time!




St John's Food Pantry: November is one of our months to serve at St John's food

CAREPORTAL- CLARK COUNTY IMPACT REPORT



CarePortal is connecting technology that drives action for local children and families in Crisis and Grace has been helping meet these needs for almost three years now. Every CarePortal connection is more than just meeting a need though—it's a chance to share God's love. Sometimes that means bringing an extra meal or bag of groceries, offering a prayer, or simply letting a

family know they are not alone. Families are deeply grateful to know someone cares.

Since CarePortal launched in Clark County in February 2022, **29 churches** and **five school districts** (Springfield City Schools, Northeastern Local Schools, and Northwestern Local Schools, Emmanuel Christian Academy, and Greenon Local Schools) have joined together to serve our community. Through these efforts, **1,303 children and 645 adults** have been helped, creating an estimated **economic impact of \$296,885**.

Grace Lutheran Church specifically has served 99 children in the last 12 months and 204 children since we joined in February of 2023. Would you like to be part of this powerful way to make a difference? Please see Sandy Thompson for more details.
