Pastor's Reflection

As you may know, our family was recently blessed with the addition of our seventh grandchild. When we see her again for our Christmas gathering, she will be two months old. What will 2026 hold for her, or for any child like her?

By this time next year, she will be walking, interrupting her siblings' efforts to play a game, feeding herself, sleeping through the night, saying "Mama" and "Dada" (or better yet, "Papa") and other simple words. The Lord willing, it will be a fun and peaceful year.

When Jesus was born, He and his earthly family had that same experience. Can you picture it? His first steps, first words? His parents enjoyed everything that parents today enjoy with their newborns.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY



The policy for how and when Grace worship and/or other ministries might be closed or cancelled due to inclement weather is as follows: Pastor Brodbeck will contact at least two members of the executive committee for consultation and assistance. If they decide to cancel activities or worship, we will use the One Call Now service that allows each of our households to receive a phone call when we cancel services. Television station WHIO channel 7 will also be alerted. A post will be made on the Grace Facebook page, a notification will be sent out on the Grace APP.

SECRET SISTERS PROGRAM RETURNS TO GRACE



You may be wondering what a Secret Sisters Program is. Here are some details that may help your understanding of our 2026 Secret Sister Program.

- Purpose: To foster deeper relationships among women within our church
- Concept: Women sign up to be paired with a "Secret Partner" for a set period. (Our set period is Feb. 1 – May 11, 2026.) Why is it secret? Each participant

has no idea who is praying for her, giving her cards and/or notes and small tokens.


- Activities: Each Secret Sister prays for her assigned sister and at least once per month surprises her assigned sister with anonymous cards or notes which offer encouragement, prayers and/or small tokens of affection.
- Reveal Party: The anonymity will conclude at a big reveal party, on the evening of May 11 and that's where Secret Sisters get a final gift.

To become a Secret Sister, complete both sides of the application form which is called "All About Me" which will be available January 4 – January 18, 2026, at the Secret Sister Station in Grace's Library. Once finished with both sides, fold the form in half and put the form in the slot on the wooden box at the Secret Sister Station. I will mail the information to your assigned Secret Sister in late January. Additional information titled "Consider Being a Secret Sister" is available in the Library at the Secret Sister Station. 
